**Contractor State Licensing Board:** Unscrupulous, unlicensed contractors often prey on victims of natural disasters. It is a felony to contract without a license in a declared disaster area. Consumers can protect themselves by using CSLB's resources to check a contractor's license status and history. 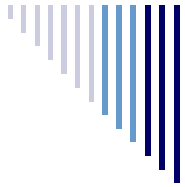

### **Department of Public Works**

**(unincorporated):** Responsible for construction and maintenance of roads and highways in the unincorporated areas of the county, to the management of the region's sanitation and flood control districts. Call the DPW Stormwater Hotline at: 888-846-0800

**Assessor/Recorder/County Clerk:** Responsible for locating, identifying and appraising all vacant land, improved real estate, business property, and certain mobile homes, boats and aircraft for property tax purposes. State law allows the Assessor's Office to temporarily reduce the assessed value of a property that was damaged or destroyed through no fault of the property owner. The damage must exceed \$10,000 and an application must be filed within 12 months from the date the damage occurred.
